Note: Adjust the temperature reading as follows before going to the temperature column in the table:

Full sun (no clouds): Add 13° Partly cloudy/overcast: Add 7°

No shadows visible/work is in the shade or at night: no adjustment

Per relative humidity: 10%: Subtract 8°


20%: Subtract 4° 30%: No adjustment

40%: Add 3°

50%: Add 6°

60%: Add 9°

‡ High levels of heat stress; consider rescheduling activities.

Proposed Legislation – H.R. 3668



On July 11, 2019, the House Workforce Protections Subcommittee held a hearing about measures proposed to protect workers from heat-related illnesses. <u>H.R.</u> 3668, introduced July 10, 2019 by Rep. Judy Chu (D-CA), would direct OSHA to create, within 42 months, a final standard that mandates workers in high-heat environments – indoors or outdoors – have paid breaks in cool spaces, access to water and exposure limitations to heat.
